## MARK PITMAN MEMORIAL FUND

## **MISSION**

To help financially disadvantaged young players from Poole, Bournemouth and surrounding areas achieve their full potential in volleyball.

## **GUIDELINES**

- 1. Youngsters must already play volleyball and be aged up to 19 (or older if not in employment)
- 2. Applicants must show some talent and good attitude in their volleyball, whether able or disabled
- 3. An application form will need to be completed, showing
  - total volleyball expenditure, including that on regional and/or national squad membership
  - circumstances which result in financial limitation eg. single parent, large family etc
  - that all information provided and grants provided will be confidential to the fund committee and recipients (except to fulfil any official reporting requirements)
  - comments by the player's coach (filled in after the applicant has handed it in) as to the player's eligibility for a grant
- 4. If possible, applications for grants will be considered, and the result communicated to the applicant within 1 month of their receipt
- 5. The Fund committee will meet every 12 months, plus as necessary to consider applications for grants. Its role will encompass:
  - Chairman (chair meetings and co-ordinate all fund activities)
  - Treasurer (maintaining accurate accounting records of funds received, expenses incurred, and grants given)
  - Secretary (call meetings, meeting minutes, annual report and communicating decisions to applicants)
  - Grant progressor (receive grant applications, liaison with applicant to clarify any queries, get coaches' comments, distribute information to committee)
  - Fund raising co-ordinator (organising fund raising activities and applying for grants eg. Talbot Trust, local Councils)
  - Publicity to local media of the Fund's activities, including distributing the annual report to the main donors, the Pitman family, and any other interested parties
- 6. At least 7 days notice must be given to all committee members of any meetings to progress the Fund's activities and formally consider grant applications. A quorum for such meetings would be 4 committee members.
